Factors include household size, monthly income, and if a member of your household is 60-years-old or older, or has a disability. The best way to determine if and how much your household will qualify for SNAP is to apply.

The income requirements for food stamps in Pennsylvania also allow for the following deductions: A deduction of 20 percent from earned income. A standard deduction of \$164 or potentially more, depending on the size of your household. A dependent care deduction, if applicable.

The Maximum Thrifty Food Plan is the maximum number of benefits a household can receive. There are no changes to the minimum benefit amount; it will remain at \$16 through September 30, 2021.

However, claimants must be aware that if they are part of households that include a disabled or elderly family member, their income limits for food stamps are slightly higher. These maximums are as follows: One-person families must earn a gross monthly income that is \$2,010 or less.

**Pennsylvania Food Stamp Program - Supplemental Nutrition...**

Gross income refers to all of your earned income (like wages and salaries) and all unearned income (like public benefits and social security) before any taxes or deductions are taken out. In order to qualify for food stamps, your gross income needs to be below the amount in the following table.

**How to Apply for Food Stamps - Just Harvest**

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) helps Pennsylvanians buy food. People in eligible low-income households can obtain more nutritious diets with SNAP increasing their food purchasing power at grocery stores and supermarkets. Those who are eligible receive an Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) ACCESS Card to make food purchases.

**Food Stamp Eligibility in Kansas | Fresh EBT**

Step 1 — Gross Income: The federal minimum wage is currently \$7.25 per hour. Full-time work at this level yields monthly earnings of \$1,256. Step 2 — Net Income for Shelter Deduction: Begin with the gross monthly earnings of \$1,256. Subtract the standard deduction for a three-person household (\$167), the earnings deduction (20 percent times \$1,256, or \$251), and the child care deduction (\$77).

Net Income Calculation Example for a 4-person household; Subtract 20% earned income deduction... \$2,050 gross income \$1,500 earned income x 20% = \$300. \$2,050 - \$300 = \$1,750; Subtract standard deduction... \$1,750 - \$181 standard deduction for a 4-person household = \$1,569; Subtract dependent care deduction... \$1,569 - \$362 dependent care = \$1,207

**SNAP Eligibility | USDA-FNS - Food and Nutrition Service**

The SNAP income guidelines in PA require households to have a low income and limited amount of financial resources. Generally, a household 's income must be at or below 130 percent of the poverty level. By definition, income includes anything that a household member earns as payment for work or other services.
